

POWER UNDER CONTROL

**"TRUE HUMILITY IS POWER RESTRAINED BY WISDOM, GUIDED BY PURPOSE,
AND EXERCISED FOR THE BENEFIT OF OTHERS."**

Humility is often misunderstood as weakness, passivity, or a lack of confidence. In reality, humility is **power under control**. It is the ability to recognize one's strengths and achievements while remaining grounded in the understanding that every person possesses inherent value and dignity.

Humility serves as the foundation for many other virtues. Respect grows when we recognize the worth of others. Gratitude flourishes when we acknowledge the contributions others have made to our success. Integrity is strengthened when we are honest about our limitations and willing to learn. Courage emerges when we are less concerned with protecting our ego and more focused on doing what is right.

Humility can be developed through intentional practice. It begins with listening more than speaking, seeking feedback without defensiveness, and being willing to admit mistakes. Humble people remain teachable. They recognize that growth is a lifelong process and that wisdom can come from anyone, regardless of status or position.

Humility is embodied through service. It appears when leaders share credit, when successful individuals extend a helping hand to others, and when people use their talents not for personal glory, but to improve the lives of those around them. It is expressed through gratitude, empathy, and genuine concern for others.

Ultimately, humility is perhaps best described by the insight that "humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less." Commonly attributed to Rick Warren and echoing ideas expressed by C.S. Lewis, this understanding shifts humility away from self-deprecation and toward self-forgetfulness. Humble people neither deny their abilities nor seek recognition for them. Instead, they focus their energy on serving others, pursuing worthy goals, and contributing to something larger than themselves. In doing so, humility becomes the fertile ground from which all other virtues can grow and flourish.
